



## East Hoathly Nursery Behaviour Policy

We aim for a positive approach to behaviour management with high expectation that behaviour will be good. We aim to do this through positive adult role models.

We support and encourage our children to make choices about how they behave.

- We always try our best.
- We join in and have a go.
- We use kind hands, feet and words.
- We share and look after our things and others.

As a way of encouraging good choices in our nursery we use a behaviour chart linked to the one used in school.

- The children always start on the sun at the start of each day and after lunch.
- If they show positive behaviour or good effort and choices they will move up to the rainbow.
- If they achieve something amazing or continue to make good choices in relation to effort, behaviour or activities they may move to the star! - They will then visit Miss Denney, Miss Lewis or Mr Proctor.

### Poor or Negative Behaviours

- If they display poor choices they will be given a warning, if they continue they will be moved to the cloud, if this continues they will move to the raincloud and have some time out or change activity.
- If a child shows continual poor choices or negative behaviour towards others they will visit Miss Denney for a reflection session. This will then be feedback to parents.
- If a child has repeated behavioural incidents a behaviour support plan will be put developed within a meeting with the parents and SENCO.
- If a child displays violent behaviour towards staff or others a behaviour support plan will be developed and in partnership with parents a reduced timetable will be discussed.

At East Hoathly we aim to learn through play and for all the children, staff and parents work together to make a caring, understanding and positive space for learning for all children.
