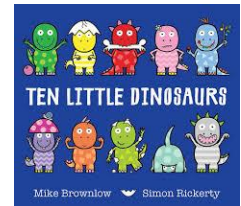
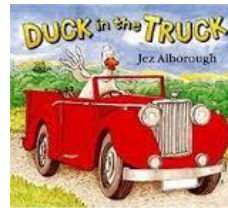
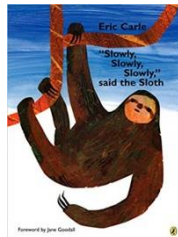
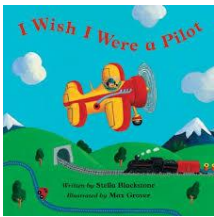
Nursery Newsletter - Term 3

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back. Happy New Year and we hope you all had a lovely Christmas.

This term, we are learning about movement and the journeys that it can take us on. We will be looking closely at how transport and our bodies move and what can be achieved when the movement is happening. As well as this, we will be taking a closer look at places we have visited and how we got there! We will be learning about the effects that movement can have on our bodies and what to do to keep ourselves healthy.

Areas of Learning

Literacy: Our focus in literacy this term is phonics, learning new letter sounds and recognition of environment sounds. We are also going to be discussing the marks that we make.

Maths: We will be continuing to improve our number recognition and skills. We will be looking at colours and shapes using road signs and traffic lights to help us notice shapes in our environment.

The main focus of the topic is to start using vocabulary associated with different movements, including how this happens with vehicles and our bodies, and how they are different or the same.

It is great to share a story at home together. You could even ask your child to tell their own story using the pictures. You could go on a welly walk and see what you can discover and see if you can recognise different shapes within your environment.
