

The Early Years Foundation Stage

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) areas of learning and development have been updated and were published by the government in 2020. These areas of learning are used when observing, assessing and planning for a child's individual needs.


There are seven areas of learning, which have sub sections to focus learning. The seven areas are also split into two areas, **Prime Areas** and **Specific Areas**.

1. The three prime areas- which are for all children and provide the solid foundations for accessing other areas of learning.
2. The four specific areas- which build upon the three prime areas to facilitate and extend learning.



We support children to develop a positive sense of themselves and others; to form positive relationships, develop social skills and learn how to manage their feelings through providing activities that stimulate team work, reflectiveness and creativity.


Young children develop control and co-ordination by being active through play, we regularly use our outdoor spaces including the woodland and trim trail to develop larger movements and malleable play for fine motor skills. Children must also be helped to understand the importance of physical activity, and to make healthy choices.


