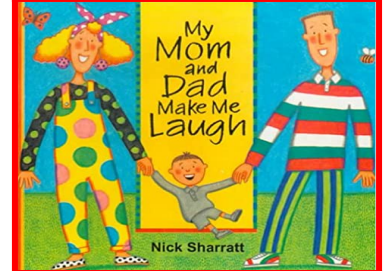
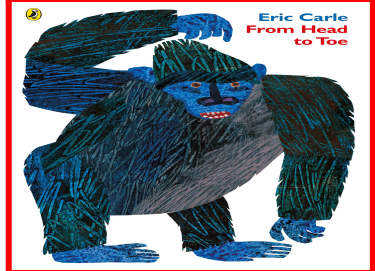
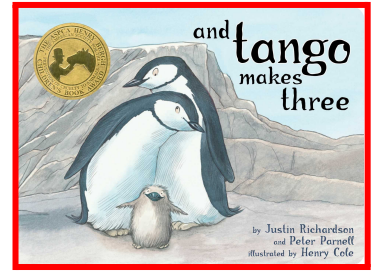
All about me


Dear Nursery Families,

Welcome back, we hope you all had a wonderful summer break and had lots of fun in this amazing weather we have had. We will be starting the year off with the topic called 'All about me', where we will be learning about our families, our interests and all the different aspects of our lives.

As part of this topic, we will be using stories to help us think about people in our own family, understanding similarities and differences between people and building new friendships.

Some of the texts we will be looking at are:



<p><u>Understanding of the World</u> Exploring our life stories and what our family tree looks like. Exploring natural materials Understanding why we must care for our environment.</p>	<p><u>Mathematics</u> Singing and exploring numbers through songs. Exploring counting objects to 5. Noticing colours and patterns in our environment.</p>	<p><u>Religious Education</u> Looking at what the harvest festival is and how we celebrate it. Tasting different fruits and vegetables from the harvest.</p>
<p><u>Communication and Language</u> Understanding simple instructions, as well as two-part instructions. Focusing on our own choice of activity. Understanding simple questions about 'what'. Using longer sentences when speaking. Singing nursery rhymes.</p>		<p><u>Physical Development</u> Playing movement games. Begin controlling mark making tools and using a comfortable grip. Making large arm movements with material to music. Putting on and taking off coats. Using a range of construction materials to build. Thinking about different spaces and where I can sit.</p>
<p><u>Expressive Art & Design</u> Exploring paint using different body parts and tools. Recognising and naming different patterns. Begin exploring repeating patterns. Singing and dancing to a variety of action songs.</p>	<p><u>Personal, Social and Emotional Development</u> Exploring new activities and expressing my own preferences. Managing transitions. Making friendships and showing confidence with new children. Understanding what different emotions look like.</p>	<p><u>Literacy</u> Playing phonics games Listening to stories and talking about what has happened. Listening to music and singing songs. Noticing letters and sounds in the environment. Exploring mark-making tools.</p>

Quick Reminders

- Please can you make sure your child brings in a water bottle and spare clothing everyday.
